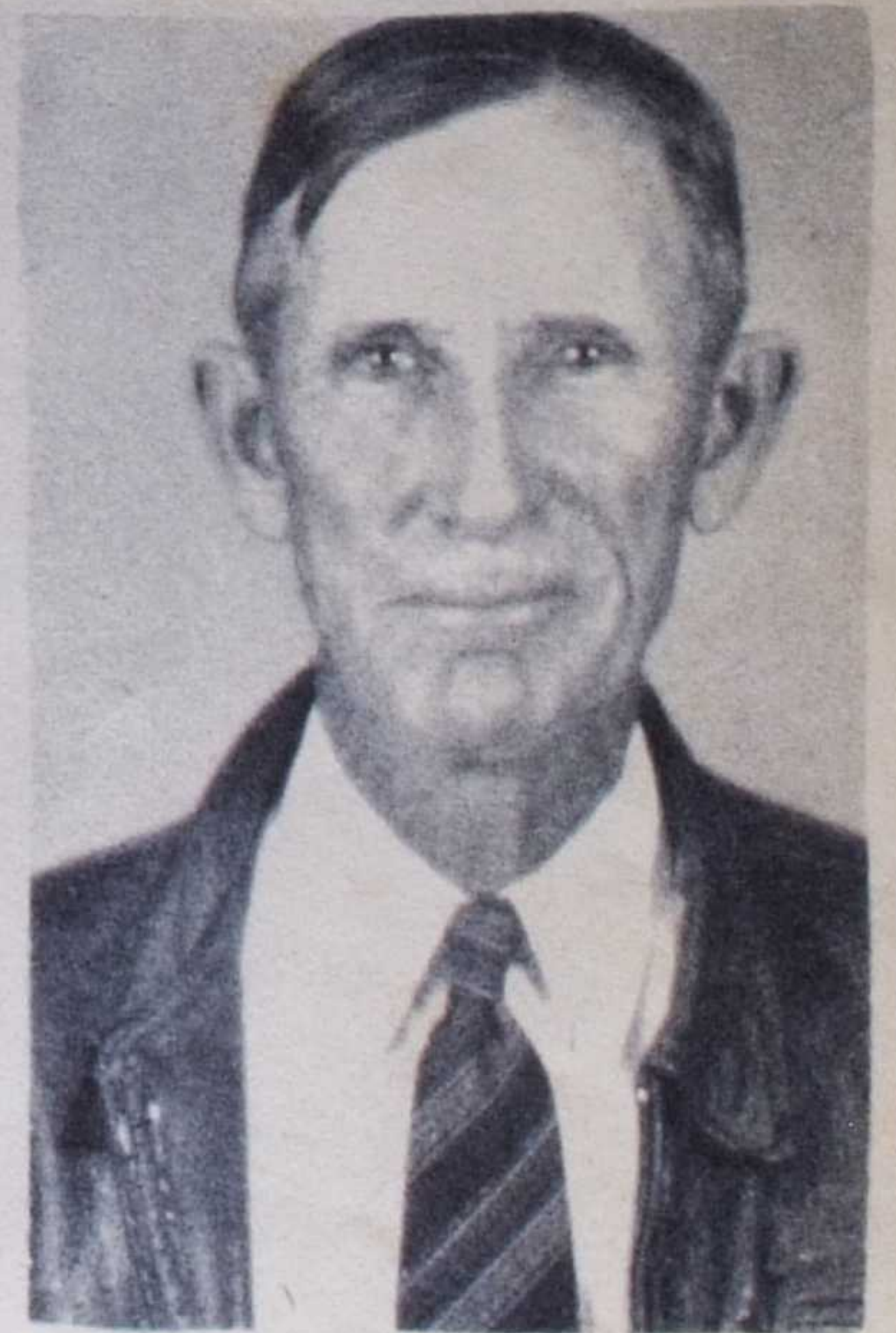

Mr. Richburg, being here only a short time, was perhaps on his way to just as clear a record and impression upon the school--and community.

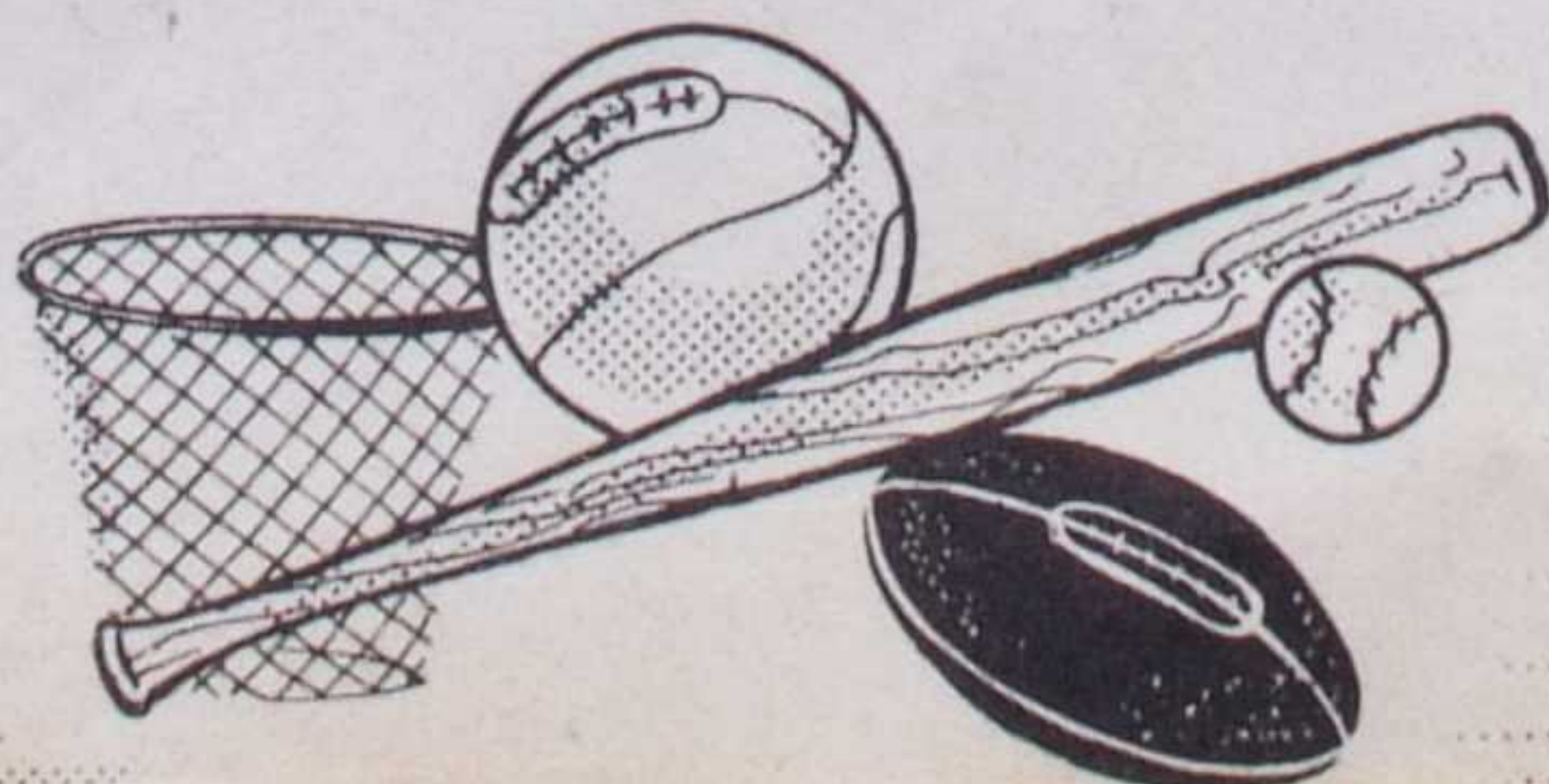

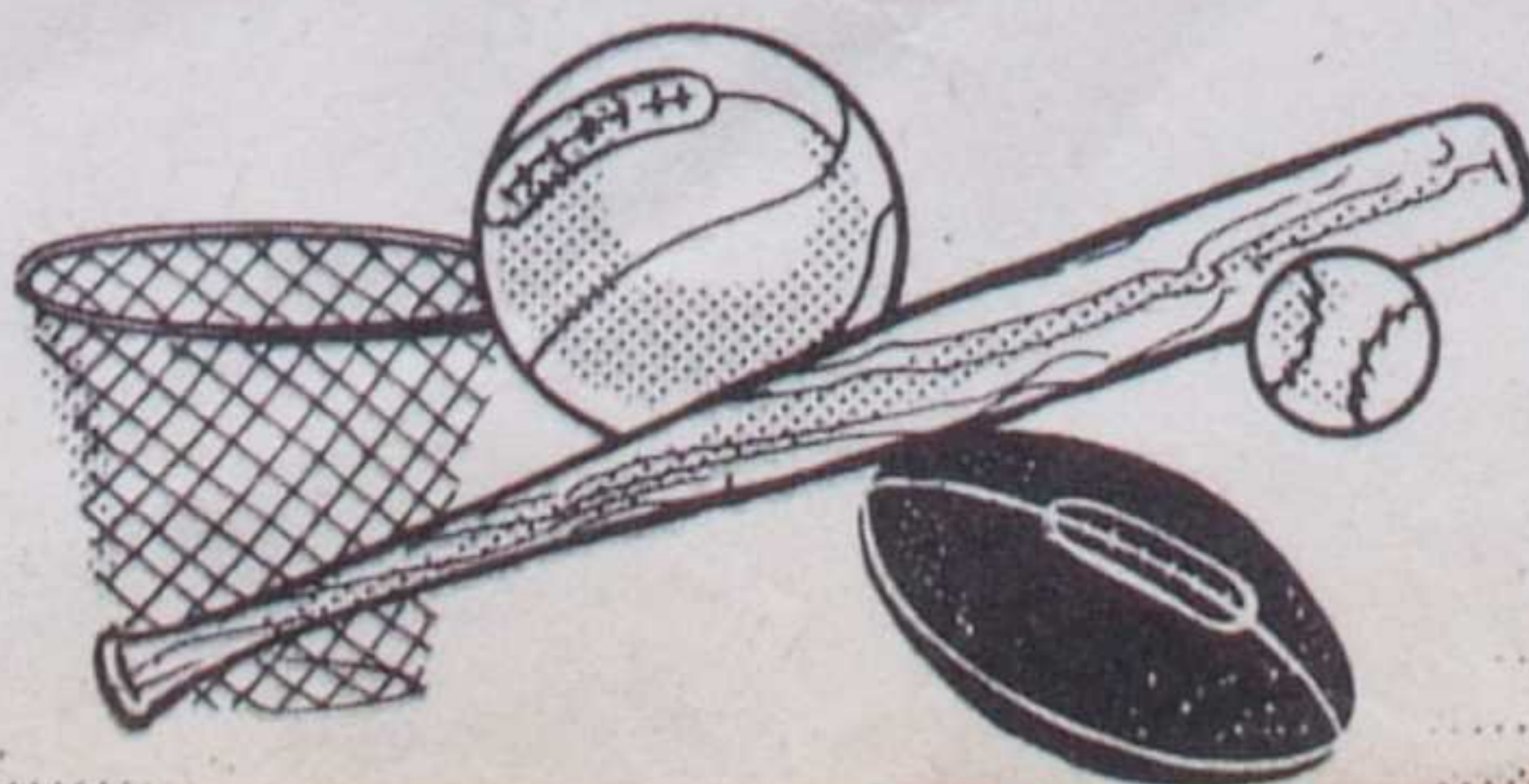
Because of lack of sports, our Sophomore year was not what it could have been. But we spent much time in study, and entered the Junior Class with twenty-five members.

Our play "The Lady Killer" was one of the best seen at Pleasant Home in many years.

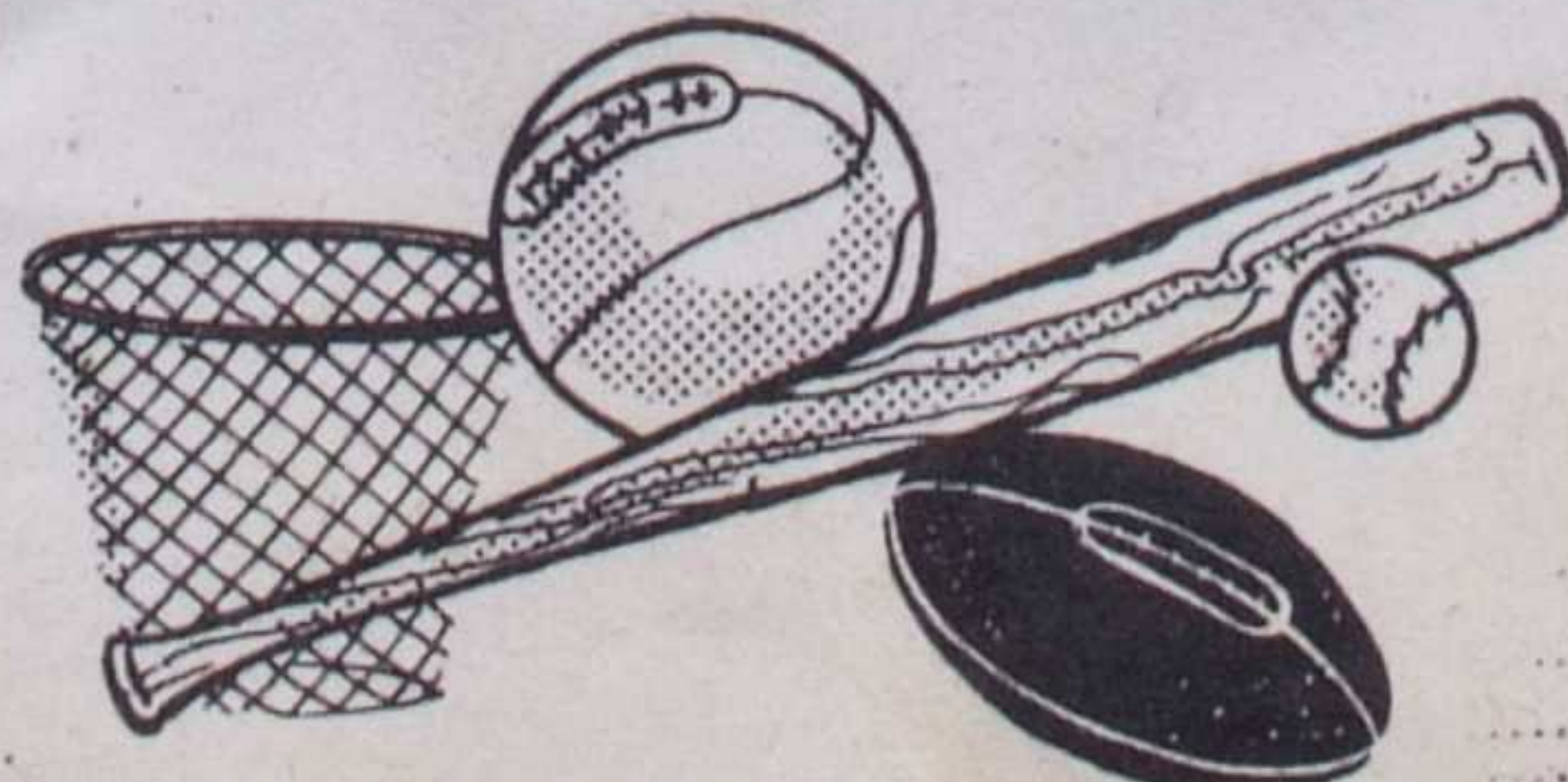
